Year 4 Birch Class – Changes to staffing for this term




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In Y6 Willow Class our Art topic was Make My Voice Heard! We explored symbolism in art and messages that are important to us before designing a piece of artwork to represent this.

This week we celebrated all things Science. As part of Hollydale's Science week, we learnt all about 'Connections'. We had a special 'Bubbleworks' Scientist visit who helped the children to explore the wonderful world of Science in an exciting and hands-on way. The children investigated electrical conductivity using a plasma ball and fluorescent tubes. They also made a human electrical circuit to explore the concepts of electrical insulators and conductors During the Science assembly they were even sending ping-pong balls soaring through the air using a powerful launcher. The children then spent the rest of the week completing small science experiments in class. Ask your child about it to see what they have learnt. Thank you for donating towards this workshop.
