Introduction of ANPR camera enforcement at Hollydale Primary School Street Closure

We will be implementing a school street closure on Hollydale Road in the vicinity of Hollydale Primary School, with ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) camera enforcement. This means that any vehicle which does not have a school street access permit and enters the restricted section of Hollydale Road between between the south-eastern kerb-line of Evelina Road and the north-western kerb-line of Gibbon Road between the hours of operation (Monday to Friday, 08:00 – 09:15 & 15:00 – 16:00 during term time) will be issued with a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN).

Residents who live within the extents of the closure are able to apply for a School Streets access permit, **free** of charge, via the following link: <u>https://www.southwark.gov.uk/parking/school-street-access-permit</u>

Tradespeople, visitors and deliveries will not be allowed to pass through during the hours of operation. Delivery drivers will be expected to park outside of the school street area and hand deliver to the property. Large deliveries such as sofas and domestic appliances will also have to be delivered outside the school street hours.

There are some motorists who may not be aware of the notices informing them of the road closure. The barriers will no longer be in place. Please ensure that your children are kept safe and do not play/walk in the road unattended, to ensure that your children are safe at all times.

Purpose and background of the scheme

The school street closure aims to reduce congestion and carbon emissions outside Hollydale Primary School during the morning and afternoon periods. Unfortunately, the school do not have the resources to manually enforce this closure on a long term basis, hence the introduction of ANPR cameras and the necessity of the access permit.

These restrictions were introduced as part of Traffic Management Order (TMO) 2022/087 which was made on 21 April 2022. Statutory consultation was carried out for these with the notice of proposals being advertised in The London Gazette, Southwark News & the Council Website (<u>Traffic Management Orders (TMO) - Southwark Council</u>).
