
#### **Donations for Sports Day**

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


## 15th July 2023: Come to our Summer Fair!

#### **Hollydale Highlights**


YR Cherry Class have been creating their own family trees as part of beginning to understand their own history. We drew and labelled ourselves and our family members.








In History, YR 1/2 Oak Class, enjoyed creating double page spreads all about 'The Great Fire of London'.




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
In Geography, they have thought about their walks to school and have made a simple map of their route.





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


Year 3 Cedar Class have enjoyed learning about the legacy of the Romans and created double spread pages to gather thinking about the most important things the Romans left behind.


