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New Spelling Scheme for Spring Term 2024




We are striving to strengthen children's basic skills; one of these being spelling. It is essential that children can spell key words which they will need to be successful writers.

We are working very hard in school to strengthen basic skills, but we need your help to boost spellings. We have created a spelling challenge to make this fun and engaging and we are offering a whole host of rewards to motivate and encourage the children to get on board!

All that we ask, is that you help your children learn to spell the words on their challenge card. Every time they have secured a section (bronze, silver or gold), remove the corresponding slip from the bottom of the sheet and give it to your child to bring to school. The staff will check that they have indeed secured the bronze, silver or gold block and the children will receive a certificate and they can begin learning the next set of spellings.

We are hopeful that this will be more meaningful than testing spellings weekly and by basing it on high frequency words and words commonly used in their writing, it will be more purposeful as it is being embedded not only in Literacy but across the whole curriculum. By the end of each half term, we expect all children to have completed at least two spelling sections e.g. Level 1 bronze and silver.




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Internet Safety Home Learning Projects








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






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
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Class Catch Up!




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Y1/2 Elm Class have been consolidating their times table and division facts knowledge for the 10 times table by playing a board game.






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
Year 5 Hazel Class have been warming up playing dominoes to investigate equivalent fractions to decimals!





Willow Class (Y6) - In Maths we have been learning about algebra. We have been solving 1step and 2 step equations.



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
