## Autumn 1 2025 - This half term Year 4 will be learning about the following topics:

English	We will begin by basing our English learning on 'Tar Beach' written by Faith Ringgold. This is a four-week planning sequence in which children will explore the devices of mystery and suspense. We will write a range of different texts-types including character descriptions, formal letters, book reviews, dialogue (direct speech). The children will also have an opportunity to retell the story.
	We will then read 'Granny Came Here On The Empire Windrush' written by Patrice Lawrence and Camilla Sucre. The will children explore the settings and themes within the text. The children will also go on to write about their personal heroes and why they admire certain people, including those figures who travelled on the Empire Windrush in 1948 or those descended from this heroic generation.
	We are working very hard in school to strengthen basic skills, but we need your help to boost spellings. We
	have created a spelling challenge to make this fun and engaging and we are offering a whole host of
	rewards to motivate and encourage the children to get on board!
	All that we ask is that you help your children learn to spell the words on their challenge card. Every time
Spelling	they have secured a section (bronze, silver or gold), staff will check that they have indeed secured the
Scheme	bronze, silver or gold block and the children will receive a certificate and they can begin learning the next
	set of spellings.
	We are hopeful that this will be more meaningful than testing spellings weekly and by basing it on high
	frequency words and words commonly used in their writing, it will be more purposeful as it is being
	embedded not only in Literacy but across the whole curriculum.
D	The children will bring home a book from the class book corner or the school library every week. Please
Reading	read and discuss the books with your child and support them with recording a comment in their records
Records	and ensure that these books are brought to school <b>every day</b> . The children will visit the school library <b>every Monday</b> where they will have an opportunity to change their reading books.
	In Numeracy pupils will continue to apply their learning about place value and recognising the value of
	each digit in 4-digit numbers. We will be ordering and comparing numbers, rounding them to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000 and knowing the number 1000 more/less than a given number, before introducing
	negative numbers. We will then move on to consolidating our knowledge of efficient written methods of
	addition and subtraction.
	Please ensure that your child knows number bonds to one hundred and all times tables and related
Maths	division facts (x2, x3, x4, x5, x6, x7, x8, x9, x10, x11 and x12) —it is vital that children know these in order
	to progress in numeracy.
	Year 4 Multiplication Check 2026 – The children will sit a National times tables test during the summer
	term. Please ensure that you are supporting and practicing all times tables (12x12) with your
	child/children.

	three weeks. Scores will be recorded and tracked using the tracking grid and the number of spellings that
	are tested will vary based on children's individual needs.
