Autumn 1 2026 - This half term Year 5-6 will be learning about the following topics:

English	In English the children will be exploring a variety of texts, including ‘Hidden Figures’ written by Margot Lee Shetterly and ‘The Man Who Walked Between the Towers’ by Mordicai Gerstein . Through these texts they will extend their writing through biographies/autobiographies and memoirs. We will be exploring how language can be used to describe settings, characters, and atmosphere. We will also explore how we can build cohesion within paragraphs.
Reading Records	We will continue with physical reading records. They are expected to bring these into school daily and write at least 4 entries a week about what they are reading. Children will have the opportunity to choose books from the school library each week. All children will be required to take their library book or classroom book home each night to read, and log comments into their reading records. Please read and discuss your child’s book with them and ensure that it is returned each day in a school bag. The library reading books will be changed weekly as and when appropriate for each child. Reading rewards will be given to children for fantastic, in-depth comments.
Spelling, punctuation and grammar	Children will continue this half term to be tested on their spellings every three weeks. Please support them in learning to spell the words on their challenge card. Every time they have secured a section (bronze, silver or gold), staff will check that they have indeed secured the bronze, silver or gold block and the children will receive a certificate and they can begin learning the next set of spellings. We are hopeful that this will be more meaningful than testing spellings weekly and by basing it on high frequency words and words commonly used in their writing, it will be more purposeful as it is being embedded not only in Literacy but across the whole curriculum.
Maths	In Maths the children will begin the term by looking at Place Value, comparing and rounding numbers to a million, and negative numbers. The children will then move on to add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4-digits using the column method. The children will also be learning how to estimate and make sensible approximations. Each child will revisit how to use the four operations and apply their knowledge to reasoning /problem-solving activities. They will continue to develop their mental maths skills and knowledge of all their times tables (12x12) through weekly time stable tests on TTRS and Maths frame . Science	In Science we will be looking at Forces . The children will be taught how to • Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object. • Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces. • Recognise that some mechanisms including levers, pulleys and gears allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.
Computing	Our topic this half term is ‘We are game developers’ in this unit, pupils develop their own interactive game on Scratch. • Session 1 - create original artwork and sound for a game • Session 2 - design and create a computer program for a computer game, which uses sequence, selection, repetition, and variables. • Session 3 - detect and correct errors in their computer game • Session 4 - use iterative development techniques (making and testing a series of small changes) to improve their game.
Topic	This half term the children will be focusing their learning on the Black History month topic ‘Inspirational Politicians’ . We will learn all about: • Martin Luther King – who was an American civil rights leader who peacefully campaigned for equality and an end to racial discrimination.

	Diane Abbot - who is a British politician who became the first Black woman elected to the UK Parliament and has campaigned for equality and social justice.
Art	This half term will focus on Art and Design . This unit will focus on the technique of drawing . Children will be taught to develop their ideas more independently, considering the purpose of drawing as they investigate how imagery was used in the 'Space race' that began in 1950s.
P.E.	PE days for Hazel class are Wednesday and Thursday . On Thursday, the children will continue to be taught by Mt Long. Please ensure that your child/children have the following kit for PE: black tracksuit bottoms or shorts, a white t-shirt or top and black trainers or plimsolls and that they attend school wearing their PE kit (and their Hollydale jumper) every Wednesday and Thursday . On Wednesday, they will have swimming (letter to follow).
Music	Children will take part in weekly Brass lessons on Thursday. Please encourage your child to rehearse regularly and bring their instrument into school.
R.E.	This term in RE, we will be learning how to answer the following questions: What do religions believe about God? Do all faiths have similar world views? They will also be learning about the different traditions and beliefs within a range of religions.
P.S.H.E. & Citizenship	This term our focus will be all about settling back into the school routine and well-being. The child will also be celebrating values and setting achievable goals for the year. The children will begin to explore what it means to find their place in the world.
E-Safety	At Hollydale we are committed to developing an understanding of E-safety for both children and parents and carers. This covers both Internet based technologies and electronic devices such as mobile phones and wireless technology. We are keen to make children aware of both the benefits and risks of new technology. Hollydale achieves this by ensuring that: - Pupils are supervised appropriately when they use the Internet. - Pupils are given clear objectives for Internet use. - Pupils are provided with lists of relevant and suitable web sites. - Pupils are aware of their responsibilities. - Curriculum planning identifies opportunities to enrich and extend learning activities via access to the Internet Internet access is purchased through London Grid for Learning (LGFL), which provides a firewall that filters out inappropriate sites. We work with the LGFL to ensure systems to protect pupils are regularly reviewed and improved. It is important that parents and carers speak to their children about how they can keep safe and behave appropriately online. It's essential to be realistic. Banning the internet or technology will not work and it often makes a child less likely to report a problem. Education around safe use is essential. Homework	We view homework as an integral part of the school experience. Active and successful pupil participation in homework supports our belief in how children learn best. Homework benefits pupils not only by promoting academic success, but also by providing valuable opportunities for parents and carers to become involved in their child's learning. Through regular homework, children develop responsibility, perseverance, self-discipline and time management. Most importantly, pupils build independence by completing school-related tasks with minimal direct help. Homework for Year 6 pupils will be set on a Friday and should be returned by Tuesday of the following week. Children will be set weekly Maths and English homework in their CGP books. These will be sent home in a homework folder. They should continue to learn their times tables, which will be tested on a regular basis, and they should continue to practice these using Times Table Rock Stars, for which they have their own logins. We kindly ask for a £5 contribution towards the cost of the homework books. This will help us cover resources and ensure every child has their own copy to support learning at home. Thank you for your support. Homework for Year 5 pupils will continue to be completed in homework books. Reading Homework Parents and carers are expected to record and sign their child's reading log each evening. Spelling Homework Children will be given spellings to learn based on the spelling challenges and these will be tested every three weeks. Scores will be recorded and tracked using the tracking grid and the number of spellings that are tested will vary based on children's individual needs. Homework Projects
